

2025 MISSION FIELD UPDATED REPORT – MISSIONS OFFICE OF IPMANAUS 2025

1. Introduction

The present report aims to present a detailed synthesis of the actions carried out by the Secretariat of Regional and Cross-Cultural Missions of the Presbyterian Church of Manaus during the year of 2025, highlighting the scope of the activities, the services performed, the regions and communities visited, the means of transportation used, the results obtained in the medical, dental and nursing areas, as well as the impact of the Clean Water, Unreached Peoples, Vocational School and Missionary Training Center (CTM) projects.

The information presented here was extracted from the consolidated database of missions and services, according to records in the official team monitoring spreadsheet.

2. Clean Water Project

During the year, 70 filters were delivered in the Purus region, in its third revisit.

For the year of 2026, it was decided by the general coordination that the Purus Project will be canceled for an indefinite period of time. This decision generated concern, since visits were carried out and promises were made related to the delivery of the filters, which will require a return to the communities to communicate that, at this moment, there will be no continuation of this specific action.

In view of this new scenario, we will begin the year of 2026 with the development of activities on the Rio Negro, right bank, in a community called Marajá, composed of approximately 30 families. We continue with the expectation and prayer that this new project may be developed according to God's will, with sensitivity, commitment and total dependence on His direction.

3. Vocational School

In 2025, the Vocational School had the active participation of 15 children, offering tutoring classes, dance and music, contributing to the educational, artistic and social development of the students served.

For the first semester of 2026, two strategic actions are planned:

- Expansion of educational services, with the opening of new enrollments to reach up to 30 children, expanding tutoring, art and dance activities.
- Implementation of the 1st Regional Training, aimed at basic education and Sunday School teachers, focusing on literacy and playful pedagogical practices, aiming at methodological updating and strengthening of teaching.

These actions aim to strengthen the pedagogical and missionary performance of the project, training educators and expanding educational reach within the community.

Another action planned for the year of 2026 is the sale of the current Vocational School building. The decision is due to the distance and unfavorable location of the property, factors that make children's participation difficult. It was observed that, when using the church classrooms — located in a central area — there was a significant increase in the number of participating students.

The resources from the sale of the building will be allocated to the construction of classrooms, art and dance rooms on the land located behind the church, ensuring better accessibility, greater integration with the community and better conditions for the development of educational activities.

4. Centro de Treinamento Missionário – CTM

In 2025, the CTM will graduate 14 students, being 4 families and 6 singles. Among the families, 3 are indigenous, belonging to the Kokama, Baniwa and Hixkaryana ethnic groups. There is also 1 single student from the Hixkaryana ethnic group.

The disciplines offered included entrepreneurship, finance, engine mechanics, beekeeping and poultry farming, in addition to theological and missiological classes.

These disciplines have a strategic character, preparing missionaries for self-sustainable and contextualized work in Amazonian communities.

For the year of 2026, there are currently 3 families and 5 singles enrolled from the following regions: Beruri, Anamã, Anori, Manacapuru, Rio Negro and Novo Airão.

Also planned for 2026 is the initiation of the first stage of the construction of the Self-Sustainable CTM Project, focusing on the renovation of existing structures, aiming to adapt the space for better use and generation of its own resources.

As a financial sustainability strategy, the space has already begun to be rented for church events, and we currently already have 15 confirmed reservations for the year of 2026, demonstrating good acceptance and income generation potential for maintenance and progress of the construction.

In parallel, continuous resource mobilization actions will be carried out to support the construction and development of the project, such as:

- Monthly sale of breakfast and lunch for church members;
- Organization of sports events, such as soccer tournaments
- Promotion of solidarity bazaars.

All these initiatives aim to strengthen the sustainability of the CTM, ensuring resources for the continuity of the construction and increasing community involvement in the development of the project.

- Daily and weekly meetings;
- Training for local leaders;
- Bible studies and foundations of faith;
- Distribution of materials (Bibles, devotionals, study notebooks);
- Testimonies of spiritual growth.

Results and Impacts:

- Spiritual: conversions, reconciliations, strengthening of faith, emergence of new leaders;
- Social: cooperation among communities, mutual help and openness to new partnerships;
- Missionary: invitations for new fronts and requests for continuous follow-up.

5. Hospital Boat Project - General Summary of Actions in the health/evangelism area

During the period from January to November 2025, 38 evangelistic-medical missions were carried out, totaling 141 days of work in the mission field.

The actions involved multiple areas of activity, with the purpose of fully serving riverside and interior communities, offering physical, social and spiritual support.

In addition, there were hundreds of participations in evangelism activities, social support and distribution of medications, as well as legal and psychological assistance, recreational activities, educational lectures and distribution of health and hygiene supplies, all activities recorded and detailed according to the attached table..

Means of Transportation Used

Access to the locations was carried out by means of boats and vehicles belonging to the Church itself or to partners.

The main means of transportation recorded for the trips were:

These partnerships were essential to enable transportation, medications and service infrastructure.

- **Number of Trips per month**

The peaks of missions occurred between June and August, a period that traditionally concentrates longer trips due to the dry season and better navigation conditions.

• Services and Activities Provided

In addition to clinical care, several social and educational activities were carried out:

In total, the following were recorded:

- 6,719 nursing consultations;
- 5,900 medical consultations;
- 1,522 dental consultations.
- 5,202 evangelism activities in general;
- 122 decisions for Christ;
- 15,377 medications distributed;
- 5,202 evangelism activities and home visits;
- 5,513 lectures;
- 4,432 recreational activities and lectures with children.

These actions reinforce the commitment to a holistic approach, serving the body, mind and spirit of the assisted populations.

• Actions for 2026

For the year of 2026, there will be some important changes in the team's area of operation, including the formation of a new health team. From previous experiences, it was possible to perceive the importance of investing in continuous training, both for health professionals and for the crew.

Thus, the first integrated training will be carried out, scheduled for February 19, 20, 21 and 22, with the objective of strengthening the team's technical, operational and safety competencies.

The training will include the following workshops:

- Biosafety in the medical and dental areas;
- Proper use of PPE and disposal of health waste;
- Good practices in food handling;
- Personal hygiene and environmental sanitation;
- Materials and inventory control;
- Simulated training for prevention to emergencies, including:
 - Loss of rudder;
 - Abandoning the vessel;
 - Firefighting;
 - Collision with another vessel.

With this training, it is expected that the entire team will be better prepared to carry out their activities with safety, efficiency and excellence throughout 2026, ensuring better service and higher quality in the services provided.

10. Missionary Impact

The impact of the actions goes beyond numbers; each service represents an opportunity to demonstrate the love of Christ and offer concrete support to the needs of the communities.

The work resulted in hundreds of lives reached, homes visited and partnerships strengthened, consolidating the Christian witness in hard-to-access regions.
