Japurá

Evangelist Edivan and his wife Elda are leading a ministry that is growing both numerically and spiritually. The congregation currently has around 40 members and maintains regular visits to the indigenous communities in the region.

Challenge: To reactivate the children's ministry project "Athletes for Christ".

Prayer Request: For greater consistency in visits to the indigenous communities.

Barcelos

Missionary Ezequias, his wife Lenise, and their 6-year-old son are actively involved in the local congregation. The field has shown steady growth, especially through home visits and community engagement. The congregation has approximately 35 members, plus frequent visitors.

Challenges: Beginning the renovation of the church roof and finding skilled labor for the installation.

Envira

Missionary Elizonir and his wife Thamara, a childless couple, serve in a congregation of about 30 communicant members. The work remains stable, with regular attendance and pastoral involvement.

Challenges: Strengthening pastoral visitation and encouraging spiritual growth within the congregation.

Maués

Missionary Francisco Cabral and his wife, both of the Baré indigenous ethnicity, face a season of ministerial stagnation. Congregational activities are limited to Sunday mornings, with a majority of children (about 25) and only 10 adults.

Challenges: Lack of electricity in the church building, need for more frequent pastoral visits, and development of new local leadership.
